Description: A goat with curly fur and blue eyes standing on a hill-like oval base. A boy with a tricorn and knee breeches is riding on its back. His head is slightly tilted and his lips are slightly open as if he is singing. Probably he originally held a fiddle and a bow in his hands. Measurement: 21x18x8,5cm. Cites available.
