LARGE PORCELAIN FIGURINE OF A BOLOGNESE DOG.

Meissen.

Date: 20th century.

Maker/Designer: Model J. J. Kaendler.

Technique: Porcelain, painted in colours.

Description: Dog in sitting posture, with broad collar with ornamental decoration. August III's favourite animal is first mentioned in February 1735 as an animal figure of the Meissen manufactory. The documents show that the Bolognese dog was originally intended for the Japanese Palace. Like many of Kaendler's animal figures, the sculpture is characterised by its strong naturalistic expression. With wavy fur, large lifelike eyes and a wide-open mouth with carefully worked out details, the figure becomes a very special work.

Measurement: 34,5x22x38cm.

Mark: Shield mark, impressed. Model number 477 incised.
