- Depicts the famous studio and garden in the Rue Cortot in Montmartre, where Valadon lived with her son Maurice Utrillo and her partner André Utter

- Works by the artist are represented in many international collections, including the Musée d'Orsay and Centre Pompidou, Paris, the Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York, and the British Museum, London
