The Daytona 116500LN is part of Rolex's 'Oyster Perpetual' collection and represents a significant step in the evolution of the Daytona series. It was unveiled at Baselworld 2016 and brought with it some significant improvements and design changes while retaining the Daytona's DNA.

The LN of the Ref. 116500LN stands for 'lunette noir' (black bezel). This refers to the one-piece monobloc Cerachrom bezel, which ensures water resistance and a secure fit of the crystal on the centre section.

Due to its hardness, it is not only extremely scratch-resistant, but also UV-resistant and corrosion-resistant in colour.

The 904L stainless steel specially developed by Rolex for the cases is an alloy that is mostly used in cutting-edge technology, the aerospace industry or the chemical industry, where maximum corrosion resistance is essential. The Rolex Daytona 116500LN embodies the perfect symbiosis of sportiness and elegance. With its unmistakable design, ultra-modern clockwork and deep connection to the world of motorsport, it is a timeless classic that can be worn both in everyday life and on special occasions.
